

## Long pop up card in a box

### Materials needed:

A4 piece of card

A4 piece of patterned paper

Die cuts/stamps etc. for embellishments.

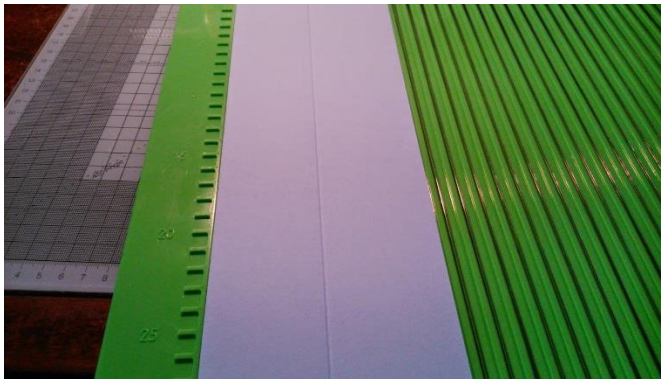
### Tools needed:

Trimmer

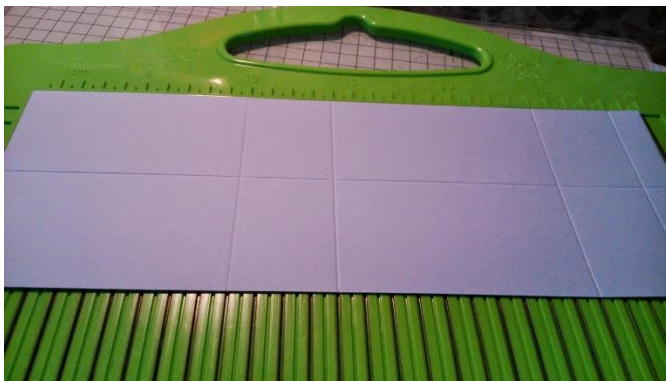
Ruler/pencil/score tool

Trim A4 card in half along the longest length to 10 ½cm.

Score at 5cm, giving you 5cm one side and 5 ½cm the other side of the score line.

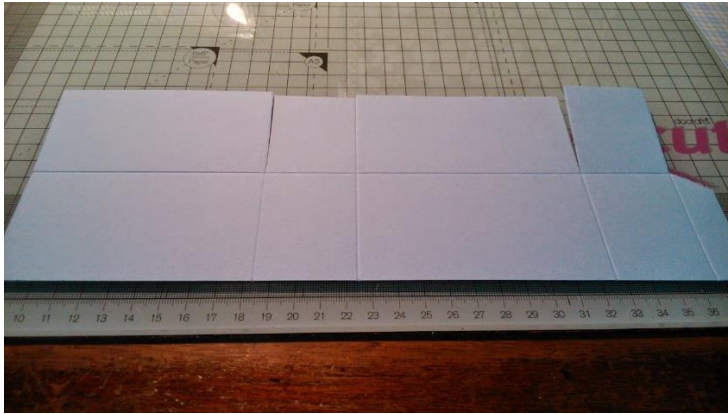


Turn the card round and score at 10cm, 14cm, 24cm and 28cm.



Cut along the score lines down to the 5cm centre score line, leaving the 5 ½cm side just scored.

The small piece at the end, cut off at the centre crease and then cut a diagonal line to create the tab used to glue the box together.



Cut backing papers:

9 ½ cm x 10cm

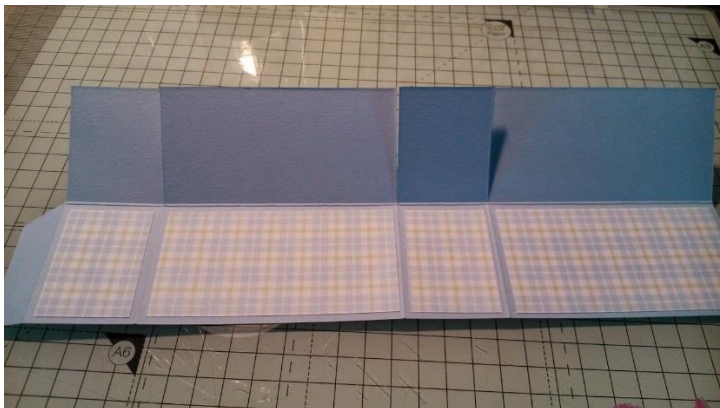
3 ½ cm x 4 ½ cm twice

9 ½ cm x 4 ½ cm

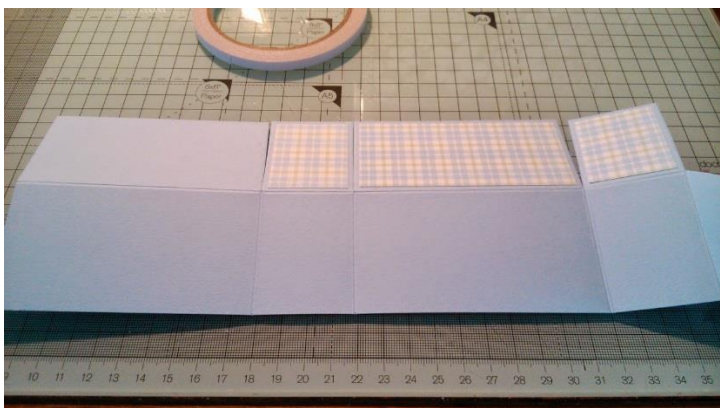
3 ½ cm x 5cm twice

9 ½ cm x 5cm

Use the largest pieces (in grey) on the bottom half of the box.



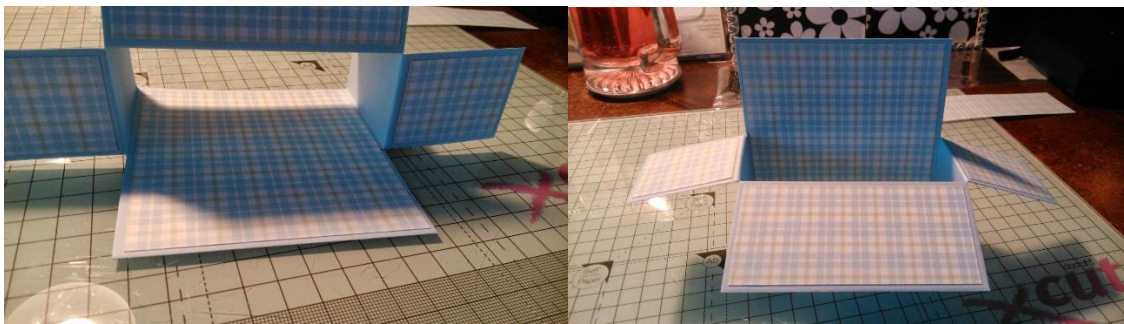
Turn the card over and use the other pieces (in black) on the top half.



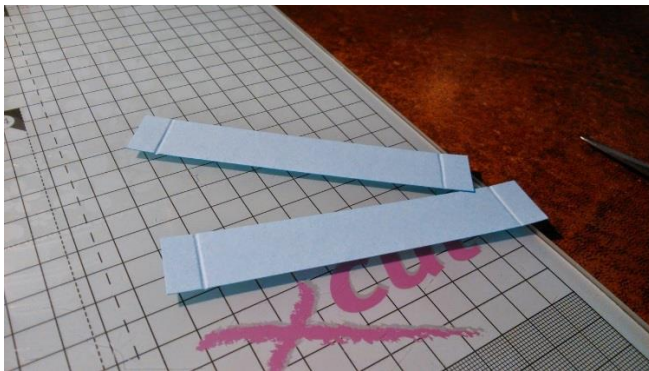
Glue the box together.



The reason I haven't glued the other piece of paper (in brown) on yet is because I stick it on after the box is made so that it covers up the tab.



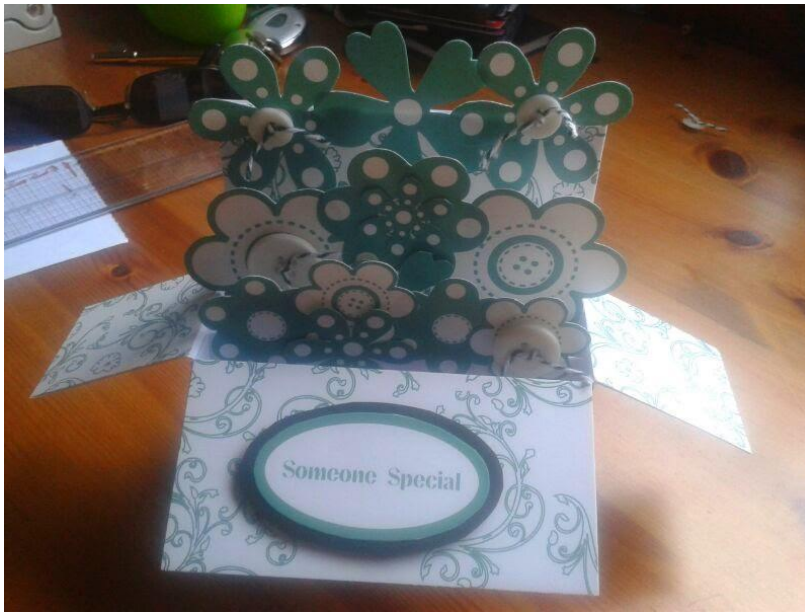
Cut two strips of plain card 2cm x 12cm. score each end at 1cm on both strips.



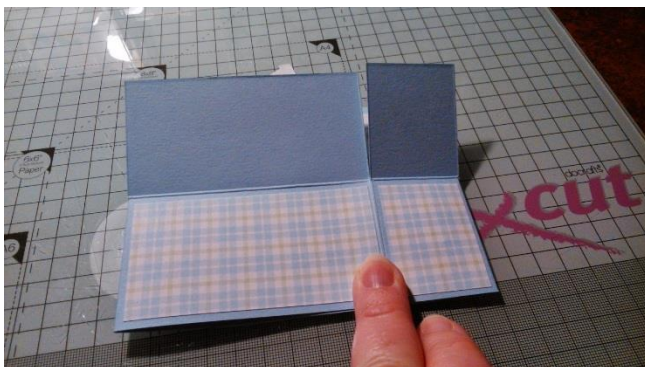
Use red tape or strong glue on the ends and stick them into the box facing opposite directions to give you two bars to stick your embellishments onto.



Now you can decorate



The card folds flat to fit into an envelope, simply lift the flaps and fold flat.
