

Pop up box card

Ingredients needed:

12 x 12 piece of card

Embellishments, stamps etc.

Acetate

Tools needed:

Score board or ruler and embossing tool

Trimmer

Scissors

Cut your piece of 12 x12 inch card down to 8 ½ x 12 inches, score lines along the longest length at 2.75, 5.5, 8.25 and 11 inches.



Turn the card round so the score lines are horizontal and trim 2 inches off, keep this for later.

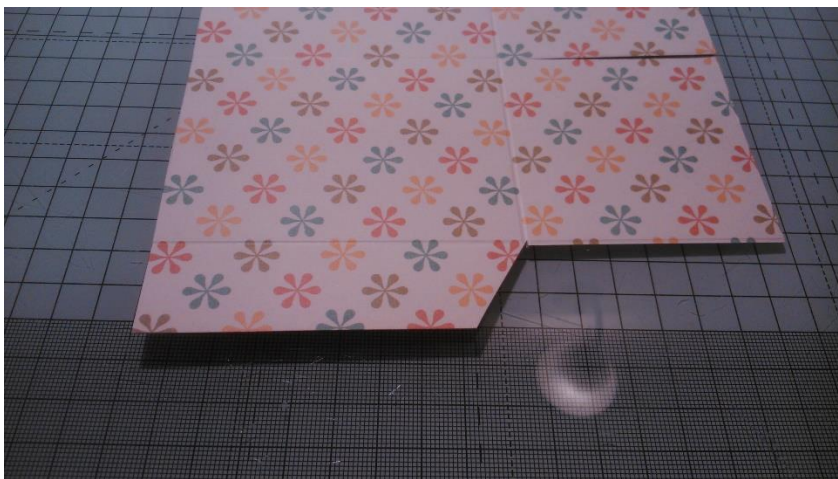
With the card in the same position, score at 2.75 inches.



Cut along all of the score lines down to the 2.75 score line. (The shortest side)



On the smallest crease line which should be 1 inch on the end, cut a diagonal line to make a flap.



Now you can put the box together by gluing the flap into the inside of the box. The shorter flaps will fold down but don't worry about folding the back one down as you want it stand up more.



The 2 inch strip that was cut off earlier, cut it from the 1 inch crease edge at 4.75 inches. This should now give you a 1 inch crease both ends.



Cut the strip in half to make two 1 x 4.75 inch strips.



Apply glue to the two ends of each strip and stick them inside the box so that it gives you 2 lines inside the box to stick your embellishments to.



Make sure the box folds flat.

Decorate with toppers, use acetate to give extra height.
